871 IAC 26.8(1) - Withdrawal of Appeal

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

Wal-Mart Stores, Inc. (employer) appealed a representative's January 30, 2006 decision (reference 01) that concluded Brenda L. Studer (claimant) was qualified to receive, and the employer's account was subject to charge because she had been discharged for nondisqualifying reasons. A hearing was scheduled on February 28, 2006. On February 27, the employer's unemployment insurance representative, TALX, faxed a withdrawal request to the Appeals Section. Based on the employer's withdrawal request, the administrative record, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision. Appellant requested the appeal be withdrawn.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

On February 27, 2006, the employer withdrew its appeal from the representatives' January 30, 2006 decision. The Appeals Section received the employer's written withdrawal request on February 27, 2006.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

871 IAC 26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of the presiding officer to whom the case is assigned. Requests for withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is tape-recorded by the presiding officer.

The employer's request to withdraw its appeal is approved.

DECISION:

The representative's January 30, 2006 decision (reference 01) is affirmed. The employer's withdrawal request is approved. The claimant remains qualified to receive unemployment insurance benefits as of January 8, 2006, provided she meets all other eligibility requirements. The employer's account may be charged.
