STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant, Bob Doan, filed an appeal from the September 3, 2021 (reference 05) lowa Workforce Development ("IWD") unemployment insurance decision that established an overpayment of LWA benefits. After proper notice, a telephone hearing was held on November 4, 2021. The hearing was held together with Appeals 21A-UI-20362-JC-T and 21A-UI-20361-JC-T. The claimant participated personally. The administrative law judge took official notice of the administrative records. Department Exhibit 1 was admitted. Based on the evidence, the arguments presented, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision.

ISSUE:

Was the claimant overpaid LWA benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant established his claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of August 23, 2020, after testing positive for COVID-19. Claimant notified employer and was placed on an unpaid leave of absence until September 7, 2020. Claimant made weekly continued claims for the two week period he did not perform work. Claimant filed for and received \$600.00 in LWA benefits for the two week period ending September 5, 2020.

The initial decision which denied benefits to the claimant has been affirmed in Appeal 21A-UI-20361-JC-T.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue in this case is whether the claimant was overpaid LWA benefits.

lowa Code section 96.3(7) provides, in pertinent part:

7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.

a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.

Since the decision disqualifying the claimant has been affirmed, the claimant was overpaid \$600.00 in LWA benefits. (See Iowa Code § 96.7(3) and August 8, 2020 Presidential Memorandum on Authorizing the Other Needs Assistance Program for Major Disaster Declarations Related to Coronavirus Disease 2019.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated September 3, 2021, (reference 05), is AFFIRMED. The claimant was overpaid \$600.00 in Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) benefits.
