STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant, Yanet Jorge Rodriguez, filed an appeal from the August 26, 2020 (reference 01) Iowa Workforce Development ("IWD") unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits. A telephone hearing was scheduled for July 28, 2021. At the time of the hearing, the claimant appeared personally. Beatriz Rodriguez also appeared for claimant. Karina Mellado appeared for the employer. A Spanish interpreter with CTS Language Link also assisted. Prior to testimony being taken, the claimant stated she wished to withdraw her appeal. The request was recorded using the Appeals Bureau conference call software.

ISSUE:

Should the request to withdraw the appeal be granted?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The administrative law judge, having considered the evidence in the record, finds that: A request has been made by the appealing party to withdraw the appeal. The request has been recorded and was made at the time of hearing by the claimant. The administrative law judge accepted the withdrawal after explaining the consequences of not conducting the scheduled hearing.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-26.8(1) provides:

(1) An appeal may be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of an administrative law judge or the manager or chief administrative law judge of the appeals bureau. Requests for

withdrawal may be made in writing or orally, provided the oral request is taperecorded by the presiding officer.

An appeal may be dismissed upon the request of a party or in the agency's discretion when the issue or issues on appeal have been resolved in the appellant's favor.

The administrative law judge has reviewed the records and files herein and concludes that the request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal should be approved.

The hearing scheduled for July 28, 2021 is cancelled.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated August 26, 2020, (reference 01) is affirmed. The request of the appealing party to withdraw the appeal is approved, and the decision of the representative shall stand and remain in full force and effect.
