#### STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

On August 3, 2021, Joel Miller (claimant/appellant) appealed the August 2, 2021 (reference 08) decision that concluded the claimant was overpaid unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$1,773.00 for the 13-week period between May 17 and August 15, 2020, based on a decision finding claimant ineligible for benefits.

A telephone hearing was held on September 29, 2021, pursuant to due notice. Claimant participated personally. The administrative law judge took official notice of the administrative record.

## **ISSUE:**

Was the claimant overpaid regular, state unemployment insurance benefits?

## **FINDINGS OF FACT:**

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds:

The administrative record shows claimant received regular, state unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$142.00 per week for a total of 12 weeks, from the benefit week ending May 23, 2020 and continuing through the benefit week ending August 8, 2020. He also received benefits in the amount of \$69.00 in the week ending August 15, 2020. The total amount of regular, state unemployment insurance benefits paid during this period is \$1,773.00.

Claimant was subsequently determined to be ineligible for benefits during this period in a decision dated October 27, 2020. That decision remains in force. See 20A-UI-10885-CL-T.

## **REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

For the reasons set forth below, the August 2, 2021 (reference 08) decision that concluded the claimant was overpaid unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$1,773.00 for the 13-week period between May 17 and August 15, 2020 is AFFIRMED.

Iowa Code section 96.3(7) provides, in pertinent part:

- 7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.
- a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.
- b. (1) (a) If the department determines that an overpayment has been made, the charge for the overpayment against the employer's account shall be removed and the account shall be credited with an amount equal to the overpayment from the unemployment compensation trust fund and this credit shall include both contributory and reimbursable employers, notwithstanding section 96.8, subsection 5.

The administrative record shows claimant received regular, state unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$142.00 per week for a total of 12 weeks, from the benefit week ending May 23, 2020 and continuing through the benefit week ending August 8, 2020. He also received benefits in the amount of \$69.00 in the week ending August 15, 2020. The total amount of regular, state unemployment insurance benefits paid during this period is \$1,773.00.

Claimant was subsequently determined to be ineligible for benefits during this period in a decision dated October 27, 2020. That decision remains in force. See 20A-UI-10885-CL-T.

Because claimant received unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$1,773.00 for which he was later deemed ineligible, he has been overpaid in that amount.

#### **DECISION:**

The August 2, 2021 (reference 08) decision that concluded the claimant was overpaid unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$1,773.00 for the 13-week period between May 17 and August 15, 2020 is AFFIRMED.
