Section 96.4-3 – Work Search

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed a timely appeal from an unemployment insurance decision dated June 2, 2004, reference 06, which imposed a warning upon a finding that the claimant had failed to make in-person job contacts for the week ending May 29, 2004. After a review of the information in the claimant's appeal letter and Agency benefit payment records, the administrative law judge concludes that no additional testimony is necessary.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having examined all matters of record, the administrative law judge finds: The claimant filed a claim for benefits effective April 4, 2004. The claimant is in training with Agency approval.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The question is whether the warning should be removed from the claimant's record. It should. Although Iowa Code Section 96.4-3 establishes a general requirement that all claimants make an active work search each week that they request benefits, the statute provides certain exceptions. One exception is for any individual in training with the Agency's approval. The evidence in this record persuades the administrative law judge that this claimant is such a person. Since the work search requirement is waived, the warning shall be removed.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated June 2, 2004, reference 06, is reversed. The warning is removed from the claimant's record.
