**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

On September 4, 2021, Francis Dunbar (claimant/appellant) appealed the August 26, 2021 (reference 03) decision that concluded the claimant was overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation in the amount of \$4,200.00 for the seven-week period ending July 25, 2020, as a result of a decision denying benefits.

A telephone hearing was held on October 29, 2021, pursuant to due notice. Claimant participated personally. The administrative law judge took official notice of the administrative record.

**ISSUE:**

Was the claimant overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)?

**FINDINGS OF FACT:**

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds:

The administrative record shows claimant received FPUC in the amount of \$600.00 per week for a total of seven weeks, from the benefit week ending June 13, 2020 and continuing through the benefit week ending July 25, 2020. The total amount of FPUC paid during this period is \$4,200.00.

Claimant was subsequently determined to be ineligible for benefits during that period in a decision dated March 8, 2021. That decision affirmed by another administrative law judge on June 8, 2021 and remains in force. See 21A-UI-07869-JC-T.

**REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:**

For the reasons set forth below, the August 26, 2021 (reference 03) decision that concluded the claimant was overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation in the amount of \$4,200.00 for the seven-week period ending July 25, 2020, as a result of a decision denying benefits is **AFFIRMED**.

PL116-136, Sec. 2104 provides, in pertinent part:

(b) Provisions of Agreement

(1) Federal pandemic unemployment compensation.--Any agreement under this section shall provide that the State agency of the State will make payments of regular compensation to individuals in amounts and to the extent that they would be determined if the State law of the State were applied, with respect to any week for which the individual is (disregarding this section) otherwise entitled under the State law to receive regular compensation, as if such State law had been modified in a manner such that the amount of regular compensation (including dependents' allowances) payable for any week shall be equal to

(A) the amount determined under the State law (before the application of this paragraph), plus

(B) an additional amount of \$600 (in this section referred to as "Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation").

....

(f) Fraud and Overpayments

(2) Repayment.--In the case of individuals who have received amounts of Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to which they were not entitled, the State shall require such individuals to repay the amounts of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation to the State agency, except that the State agency may waive such repayment if it determines that –

(A) the payment of such Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation was without fault on the part of any such individual; and

(B) such repayment would be contrary to equity and good conscience.

The administrative record shows claimant received FPUC in the amount of \$600.00 per week for a total of seven weeks, from the benefit week ending June 13, 2020 and continuing through the benefit week ending July 25, 2020. The total amount of FPUC paid during this period is \$4,200.00.

Claimant was subsequently determined to be ineligible for benefits during that period in a decision dated March 8, 2021. That decision affirmed by another administrative law judge on June 8, 2021 and remains in force. See 21A-UI-07869-JC-T.

Because the claimant is ineligible for regular unemployment insurance (UI) benefits during the above period, he is also ineligible for FPUC during that period. Claimant has therefore been overpaid FPUC in the amount of \$4,200.00.

**DECISION:**

The August 26, 2021 (reference 03) decision that concluded the claimant was overpaid Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation in the amount of \$4,200.00 for the seven-week period ending July 25, 2020, as a result of a decision denying benefits is **AFFIRMED**.
