STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant/appellant, Paul A. Skinner, filed an appeal from the March 16, 2021 (reference 01) lowa Workforce Development ("IWD") unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits and stated he was ineligible for benefits effective May 10, 2020, due to a requested leave of absence. The parties were properly notified about the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on June 2, 2021. The claimant participated personally and was represented by Jay M. Smith, attorney at law. The employer participated through Sarah Yaley, HR Generalist. Jacob Simmons attended as an observer.

The administrative law judge took official notice of the administrative records. Based on the evidence, the arguments presented, and the law, the administrative law judge enters the following findings of fact, reasoning and conclusions of law, and decision.

ISSUES:

Was the claimant able to and available for work effective May 10, 2020? Was the claimant voluntarily unemployed due to a leave of absence?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant has worked for the employer since 2017. In May 2020, he was working as a full-time production technician in employer's Fort Madison plant.

Claimant was diagnosed with COPD in May 2020. He worked May 7, 2020 and took vacation the following day. Claimant requested and was approved for a leave of absence due to being high risk if exposed to COVID-19. His leave of absence, which lasted from May 11, 2020 through June 18, 2020, was unpaid. Employer had work available for claimant during this period. He returned to work May 19, 2020.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes the claimant is not eligible for regular state benefits effective May 10, 2020.

Iowa Code section 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.1A, subsection 38, paragraph "b", subparagraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(10) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(10) The claimant requested and was granted a leave of absence, such period is deemed to be a period of voluntary unemployment and shall be considered ineligible for benefits for such period.

The administrative law judge recognizes the claimant has filed his current claim due to hardship related to the COVID-19 pandemic. Here, the employer has work available for the claimant. However, the claimant informed the employer he was unable to work due to being high risk if exposed to COVID-19. The employer agreed to allow the claimant time off for that reason. The claimant is considered to be on a leave of absence and is not available for work, according to lowa law. Therefore, the claimant is not eligible for regular, state-funded unemployment insurance benefits.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated March 16, 2021, (reference 01) is affirmed. The claimant was not able and available for work effective May 10, 2020. Regular unemployment insurance benefits funded by the state of lowa are denied until such time the claimant is able to and available for work.
