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Section 96.4-3 - Able to and Available for Work

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant appealed an unemployment insurance decision dated May 23, 2005, reference 02, that concluded the claimant was unable to work from January 9, 2005, through February 26, 2005. A telephone hearing was held on June 14, 2005. The parties were properly notified about the hearing. The claimant participated in the hearing. No one participated in the hearing on behalf of the employer.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant worked for the employer as a concrete worker until January 6, 2005, when he was temporarily laid off due to lack of work. He filed a new claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of January 9, 2005.

The claimant had an operation for heart problems on January 7, 2005. As a result, he was unable to work from January 7 through January 17, 2005. As of January 18, the claimant had recovered from the operation and was able to and available for work, including work for the employer. He returned to work for the employer when he was called back to work on February 28, 2005.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue in this case is whether the claimant is able to work, available for work, and earnestly and actively seeking work as required by Iowa Code section 96.4-3.

The claimant was unable to work from January 7 through January 17, 2005. As a result, the claimant was ineligible for unemployment benefits for the week ending January 15, 2005. The unemployment insurance rules provide that a claimant must be available for a majority of the week in order to receive benefits. He, therefore, was eligible to receive benefits for the week ending January 22, 2005, and thereafter.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated May 23, 2005, reference 02, is modified in favor of the claimant. The claimant is ineligible for benefits for the week ending January 15, 2005, because he was unable to work. The claimant is eligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits effective January 16, 2005, provided he is otherwise qualified.
