STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed an appeal from the March 24, 2015, (reference 04) unemployment insurance decision that denied benefits. The parties were properly notified about the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on May 1, 2015. Claimant participated. Employer participated through Sue Hirschman, Human Resources Manager and was represented by Julia Day of Corporate.

ISSUE:

Is the claimant able to and available for work?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant suffers from a auto immune disease that causes her to pass out unexpectedly. Her physician and family do not believe she can work at this time as she is currently attending school and that takes all of her energy.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes that the claimant is not able to work and available for work.

Iowa Code § 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in § 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph 1, or temporarily unemployed as

defined in § 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of § 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under § 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(1) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(1) An individual who is ill and presently not able to perform work due to illness.

The claimant is currently unable to work due to her immune disease. Accordingly, benefits are denied.

DECISION:

The March 24, 2015 (reference 04) decision is affirmed. The claimant is not able to work and available for work effective March 8, 2015. Benefits are denied.
