STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Russell Halamar filed an appeal from a decision issued by Iowa Workforce Development (the Department) dated November 19, 2010, reference 02. In this decision, the Department determined that Mr. Halamar was ineligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits from November 14 through 20, 2010 because he did not establish justifiable cause for failing to participate in reemployment services.

The Department issued a subsequent decision on December 23, 2010 finding that Mr. Halamar did establish justifiable cause for not participating in reemployment services. The decision established Mr. Halamar's eligibility for unemployment insurance benefits beginning November 14, 2011.

The Department's most recent action allowing benefits for the week in question has made the appellant's case moot as he has received the benefits that he sought through

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the appeal process.

DECISION

The appellant's appeal is dismissed as moot. The appellant has received benefits for the week in which he was previously disqualified. The Department shall take any action necessary to implement this decision.

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
