STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed an appeal from the June 28, 2019 (reference 04) decision that denied benefits for the one week period ending June 22, 2019. Due notice was issued for the hearing. A telephone hearing was held on July 25, 2019. Claimant participated.

ISSUE:

Was the claimant able to and available for work for the one week period ending June 22, 2019?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

Having reviewed all of the evidence in the record, the administrative law judge finds: Claimant was out of the country on vacation from June 15 through June 21, 2019.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

For the reasons that follow, the administrative law judge concludes that the claimant is not able to and available for work for the one week ending June 22, 2019.

Iowa Code section 96.4(3) provides:

An unemployed individual shall be eligible to receive benefits with respect to any week only if the department finds that:

3. The individual is able to work, is available for work, and is earnestly and actively seeking work. This subsection is waived if the individual is deemed partially unemployed, while employed at the individual's regular job, as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "b", unnumbered paragraph (1), or temporarily unemployed as defined in section 96.19, subsection 38, paragraph "c". The work search requirements of this subsection and the disqualification requirement for failure to apply for, or to accept suitable work of section 96.5, subsection 3 are waived if the individual is not disqualified for benefits under section 96.5, subsection 1, paragraph "h".

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Iowa Admin. Code r. 871-24.23(25) provides:

Availability disqualifications. The following are reasons for a claimant being disqualified for being unavailable for work.

(25) If the claimant is out of town for personal reasons for the major portion of the workweek and is not in the labor market.

A claimant who is out of the country for the majority of the week is not considered able to and available for work that week, even if job searches are made. Accordingly, benefits are denied for the one week ending June 22, 2019.

DECISION:

The June 28, 2019, (reference 04) decision is affirmed. The claimant is not able to and available for work for the one week ending June 22, 2019. Benefits are denied.
