Iowa Code § 96.3(7) - Recovery of Benefit Overpayment

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

The claimant filed an appeal from the October 12, 2021, (reference 02) unemployment insurance decision that concluded he was overpaid \$493.00 in regular unemployment insurance benefits. After proper notice, a telephone hearing was conducted on December 10, 2021. The hearing was held jointly with appeal 21A-UI-23264-SN-T.

The claimant passed away on June 4, 2021. Ms. Machin testified on his behalf. Ms. Machin provided a document stating the claimant's funeral was on June 12, 2021. She also provided a notice of probate that had been filed in the Iowa district court of Mitchell County. These documents were marked and admitted as claimant's Exhibit A. The claimant provided a bank statement which was marked and admitted as Exhibit B. The claimant's estate is represented by Patrick J Rourick, attorney-at-law. Official notice was taken of the agency records. Exhibits D-1 and D-2 were received into the record.

ISSUE:

Has the claimant been overpaid any unemployment insurance benefits?

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The claimant filed a new claim for unemployment insurance benefits with an effective date of September 27, 2020.

The claimant filed for and received a total of \$493.00 in regular, state unemployment insurance benefits for the week ending October 3, 2020. The claimant submitted a copy of a bank statement showing she received \$419.05 net on October 15, 2020, which corresponds with the agency records.

The unemployment insurance decision that disqualified the claimant from receiving unemployment insurance benefits has been affirmed in a decision of the administrative law judge in appeal 21A-UI-23264-SN-T.

REASONING AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW:

The issue in this case is whether the claimant was overpaid regular unemployment insurance benefits.

Iowa Code section 96.3(7) provides, in pertinent part:


- 7. Recovery of overpayment of benefits.
- a. If an individual receives benefits for which the individual is subsequently determined to be ineligible, even though the individual acts in good faith and is not otherwise at fault, the benefits shall be recovered. The department in its discretion may recover the overpayment of benefits either by having a sum equal to the overpayment deducted from any future benefits payable to the individual or by having the individual pay to the department a sum equal to the overpayment.

Since the decision disqualifying the claimant has been affirmed, the claimant was overpaid \$493.00 in unemployment insurance benefits.

The claimant may have to repay the benefits received thus far, unless the claimant applies and is approved for PUA, as directed in the paragraph below.

DECISION:

The unemployment insurance decision dated October 12, 2021, (reference 02), is affirmed. The claimant was overpaid \$493.00 in regular, state unemployment insurance benefits.
