STATEMENT OF THE CASE

Joy Talley filed an appeal from a decision issued by Iowa Workforce Development (the Department) dated September 9, 2011, reference 03. In this decision, the Department determined that Ms. Talley was ineligible to receive unemployment insurance benefits effective September 4, 2011 because she failed to participate in a reemployment services orientation on September 7, 2011.

The case was transmitted from Workforce Development to the Department of Inspections and Appeals on October 31, 2011 to schedule a contested case hearing. A Notice of Telephone Hearing was mailed to all parties on November 1, 2011. On December 12, 2011, the parties convened for hearing. At that time, the appellant

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indicated a desire to withdraw her appeal. The Department's regulations permit an appeal to be withdrawn at any time prior to the issuance of a decision upon the request of the appellant and with the approval of the presiding officer.¹

DECISION

The appellant's request to withdraw her appeal is approved and the appeal is deemed withdrawn.
